
Radio devices help people talk together.

Radio devices control moving objects.




CHILD: Radio devices are used to control or track moving objects. Find some examples.

CHILD: People can use radio devices to have fun. Find a few examples.

ADULT: Share a story about using a radio device to have fun when you were younger.

BOTH: Think of a way you can use radio devices to have fun together.



Radio devices keep us safe.



CHILD: Radio devices can help people in danger and keep us safe. Find some examples.

ADULT: Encourage your young partner to tell a story about one of the ways that radio devices keep us safe.



Radio devices can send sound and images.



CHILD: Radio devices can send sound or images. Find examples of both.

ADULT: If you could send a sound or an image to your whole community, what would it be? What about your young partner?



Radio devices provide information.



CHILD: We can learn important information from radio devices. Find examples of information.

ADULT: Encourage your young partner to reflect on why it is important that the information from these radio devices is correct?
